## LAYING THE FOUNDATION FOR CHANGE.

### HELPING ORGANIZATIONS DEDICATED TO MAKING A DIFFERENCE.

Once the MDC/Richmond American Homes Foundation was established in 1999, the focus on giving gained momentum. In its first year of giving, the Foundation donated a total of \$250,000, with funds going to The Denver Campus of Jewish Education, the Tennyson Center for Children and the Gold Crown Foundation.

Directing funding where it was needed most became a streamlined process and the Foundation was able to act quickly in times of crisis. In 2010, following the devastating earthquake in Haiti, Colorado governor Bill Ritter



organized a mission to bring 32 orphans in the final stages of adoption safely home to new parents. The Foundation was quick to lend financial support and helped make the governor's mission possible.

Likewise in 2020, with a global pandemic rocking our nation and the world, the Foundation wanted its Fidelity Donor Advised Fund contributions to help with relief efforts. At the Foundation's recommendation, Fidelity's fund made a substantial donation to Mile High United Way for COVID-19 assistance.

The following pages detail similar success stories. Millions of dollars have been aimed at creating positive change by helping organizations that share our passion for making a difference.

Always searching for new and innovative ways to deepen its impact and broaden its reach, the Foundation restructured in 2016 to align with Lion Global Foundation. Together, they have expanded their opportunities to engage in effective philanthropy.

## CREATING AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

Thousands of people experience homelessness in the U.S. every year. It's a problem that's especially close to our hearts, and the reason we support organizations focused on providing safe housing.



#### SAFE AND DIGNIFIED HOUSING

HomeAid® Colorado's mission is to help people experiencing or at risk of homelessness build new lives through construction, community engagement and education. Since its inception 25 years ago, they have completed over 43 construction projects valued at nearly \$17 million, with \$7 million in in-kind donations. HomeAid maximizes relationships within the building industry to support local service providers who assist families, victims of domestic violence, seniors, veterans, teen mothers and more.

When a veteran SEAL who exited service in 2003 reached out to NSF, he was in a bad place, needing assistance to recover from substance abuse problems. NSF stepped in to cover his bills while he attended rehab. From there, they enrolled him in a specialized fitness program to address sleep, pain and emotional regulation to prevent relapse. Today, he is still sober, has custody of his children and credits NSF with saving his life.

#### **BEARING THE FINANCIAL BURDEN**

When a loved one must undergo life-saving treatments far from home, expenses can add up fast. Fisher House Foundation (FHF) had a vision of helping both active military and veterans who struggle to afford lodging near a family member in a medical facility. With a network of 96 homes, families of those who are wounded, injured or ill can stay at no cost for as long as the treatment plan recommends. FHF also operates a frequent flyer miles donation program to cover travel and hotel expenses, allowing even more families to be exactly where they need to be.

### STEPPING IN AT A TIME OF NEED -

In 2019, veteran José Antommarchi García was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer by a private doctor in his small village in Puerto Rico. Specialized treatment thousands of miles away was his only chance at survival. As a non-English speaker, coordinating this trip felt impossible, but Fisher House stepped in to help him navigate the system and provide a place to stay. Together with his wife Rosa, José traveled to a VA hospital in Chicago where he received the treatment he needed.

Due to unstable family situations or spending time in highly institutionalized environments, many youth do not yet have the skills necessary to live on their own. It is our job as a community to help traumatized teens become successful and productive adults.



#### AROUND-THE-CLOCK CARE

What started out as one shelter for troubled teens has since become a continuum of services helping youth become productive members of society. Today, Third Way Center offers around-the-clock treatment and care to teens who are high risk, disadvantaged or dealing with complex mental health issues. Third Way's programming now includes eight residential houses in five locations across the Denver area, plus two alternative high schools and four specialized treatment programs.


#### SUPPORT FOR INNOVATION

#### **COLLABORATIVE SUPPORT**

At its core, Rose Andom Center is a family justice center, bringing together nonprofit organizations and government agencies to provide services to survivors of intimate partner violence. Not every survivor's needs are the same. Whether an individual requires crisis intervention, legal advocacy, housing information or counseling, Rose Andom Center offers real answers and the hope they need to rebuild.

When Sophie first called Rose Andom Center in 2020, the pandemic was in full force and she was isolated with her abuser. An advocate immediately got to work, helping her with emotional support and safety planning. Sophie's testimony helped convict her abuser of domestic violence. Through a partner organization, Undestructable, she was able to find confidence and a sense of community. Today, she teaches the same job readiness program that helped her build a safer life.

Lincoln Veterans Memorial Park is part of the Capitol Complex in downtown Denver. Our Foundation is proud to support two exceptional memorials dedicated to military veterans.



In 2007, former Colorado Governor Bill Ritter signed a law to create a commission charged with erecting a memorial to honor Coloradans killed in action. We decided to do our part by underwriting the cost of construction. As the most decorated battle tank commander in American history and the highest-ranking Jewish soldier in World War II, Major General Maurice Rose will be remembered as one of Colorado's greatest heroes. After growing up in Denver, General Rose went on to serve in both World Wars and was killed in action during WWII on Europe's Western Front. 

### **ETHIOPIAN SPINES PROGRAM -**

Born to farmer parents in the city of Sodo Gurage, Asrat had severe scoliosis due to a bout with childhood polio. His spinal deformity became more pronounced and painful with time, and he was constantly bullied at school. In 2021, JDC's spine outreach program, led by Dr. Rick Hodes, visited the area. Two surgeries later, Asrat's spine is straight and he's studying agroeconomics at Ambro University. The Ethiopian Spines Project has treated over 1,300 similar spinal patients and hundreds more are awaiting surgery.
